### NOW LET'S GO TO:

• → Acts 13:17-20

490 years passed from the time of Moses to Samuel the prophet
490 = probationary time
(see → Matthew 18:21-22)

- →Acts 13:21
- They asked Samuel for a King
- God warned them what would happen by asking for a King, for this was never his purpose (Judges 8:22-23; 1 Samuel 8:1-7) (See → Ezekiel 20:25)

### KINGS OF ISRAEL:

- 1. Saul (Acts 13:21; 1 Samuel 15:1)
- 2. David (1 Chronicles 10:13-11:3)
- **3. Solomon** (1 Chronicles 29:23)

Because of Solomon's sin in worshipping the Idols of all 700 of his wives, God told him the kingdom Would be split into 2 and that the larger portion would be given to a servant, and the smaller portion be given to his son Rehoboam

# THERE ARE NOW 2 KINGDOMS AS THE RESULT OF SOLOMON'S SIN:

- Israel, aka the "northern kingdom", consisted of 10 tribes
- Judah, aka the "southern kingdom", consisted of 2 tribes (Judah and Benjamin)(mingled as 1)

# THE KINGS OF ISRAEL AND JUDAH

<u>The Kingdom of ISRAEL</u>:

After the split of the kingdom as a whole, there were 19 kings of Israel Jeroboam was the 1<sup>st</sup> king and King Hoshea was the last king of Israel

(2 Kings 17:21; 2 Kings 17:1-6)

Carry away = to SCATTER (Isaiah 41:16; **Remember** → Leviticus 26:14,33; **AND** PK 295.1-296.1)

• The Kingdom of JUDAH:

After the split of the kingdom as a whole, there were 20 Kings of Judah Rehoboam, Solomon's son, was the 1<sup>st</sup> king and Zedekiah, Josiah's son, was the last king But somewhere between the first king and the last, King Manasseh was taken captive

### BOTH KINGDOM'S AND THEIR KINGS, FOR THE MOST PART, BROKE GOD'S LAW/HIS SABBATH/WORSHIPPED IDOLS

- As a result, both were to receive the punishment that Moses spoke of regarding being scattered into heathen lands and being ruled by pagan, heathen kings/kingdoms that didn't like Israel
- King Hoshea, the last king of Israel, was taken captive in 723 B.C. by the Kingdom of Assyria

- Kings Jehoiakim, Jehoiakin/Jehoiachin, and Zedekiah, the last 3 kings of Judah, were taken captive and ruled over by Nebuchadnezzar/Babylonian kings
  - See  $\rightarrow$  Daniel 1:1-2(King Jehoiakim) (<u>1<sup>st</sup> siege</u> by Nebuchadnezzar)
    - 2 Kings 24:15, 16, 13{PK 438.2} (King Jehoiachin, AKA Jeconiah) (<u>2<sup>nd</sup> siege</u> by Nebuchadnezzar) Jeremiah 52:31 (this king who helps Jehoiachin later is →Evilmerodach, Nebuchadnezzar's son)
       2 Kings 25:1-7 (King Zedekiah) (<u>3<sup>rd</sup> siege</u> by Nebuchadnezzar)
  - NOTE: Because of continual idol worship and breaking God's 7<sup>th</sup> day Sabbath, God allowed his people to be ruled by pagan/heathen kings/kingdoms
    - See → Leviticus 26:1-4,14,17,33

# THERE WERE 5 PAGAN KINDGOMS THAT RULED OVER GOD'S PEOPLE

(The dates below are not necessarily from when the kingdoms actually started, but when they began to rule over God's people)

- Assyria
  - 723 B.C 677 B.C.

- Babylon
  - 677 B.C. 538 B.C.

677 B.C. is the year Babylon came into connection with God's people by taking Manasseh captive (606 B.C. is The Golden Age of Babylon, since the days of King Nebuchadnezzar)

- Medo-Persia
  - 538 B.C. 331 B.C.
- Greece (in the West/not all of Alexander's divided kingdom) 331 B.C. 168 B.C.
- Pagan Rome
  - <u>168 B.C</u>. Macedonia becomes a Roman province
  - <u>161/158 B.C.</u> The Roman kingdom became connected with the people of God by making a league with the Jews to protect them from the Greeks
  - <u>65 B.C.</u> Pompey, the Roman general, defeats the last of the Seleucidae(Syria kingdom)(the Northern part of Alexander's divided kingdom) and makes Syria a Roman Province
  - <u>63 B.C.</u> Pompey, the Roman general, makes Jerusalem a Roman province, ending Judea's independence
  - <u>31 B.C</u>. Rome, under Octavian(later known as Augustus Caesar), conquers Egypt, in the Battle of Actium, against Cleopatra and Marc Antony
  - **NOTE:** At this time(31 B.C.), Rome now rules the whole world, having conquered all of Alexander's divided kingdom. 31 B.C. is the starting point for the "time" prophecy(360 years) taking us to 330 A.D.
  - <u>330 A.D.</u> Constantine moves the Roman headquarters from the West to the East, the Byzantine Empire, later naming it after himself, calling it Constantinople. This moving of headquarters to the east sets Rome up for invasion in the west
  - <u>356 476/483 A.D</u>. Rome divided into 10 by barbarians of the North, France being one of these divisions
  - 496 A.D. King Clovis of France converts to Catholicism
  - 508 A.D. He(king Clovis), convinced the other 6 pagan kingdoms of divided Rome to pay homage to Catholicism. The other 3 kingdoms that did not submit to Catholicism were Arian
  - 508-538 A.D Papalism was in preparation for its ministry x 30 years, just as Christ was preparing x 30 years

#### THEN, THE PAPACY RULED OVER GOD'S PEOPLE FROM:

• 538-1798 A.D.

= <u>1260 years</u> <u>Also referred to as</u> → <u>42 months</u> (Revelation 11:2-3)

There are 30 days in 1 biblical month (Genesis 7:11,24; 8:3-4)600th year of Noah's life, 2nd month, 17th day of the month+ 150 days600th year of Noah's life, 7th month, 17th day of the month= exactly 5 months150 days/5 months = 30 days in each month2nd Witness(1 Corinthians 13:1) is found in  $\rightarrow$  Revelation 11:2-31260 Biblical days/42 months = 30 Biblical daysSo 30 days in 1 biblical month x 12 months3 ½ Times AKA 3 ½ Years = 360 + 360 + 360 + 180 = 1260because 1 Time = 1 Biblical Year
